

THE PROGRAM

Through this extraordinary program, English students and cultural enthusiasts have the invaluable opportunity to keep on track for graduation while studying in the Paris, the "City of Lights." Program participants can experience firsthand the magical city that over the centuries has inspired poets, writers, artists and revolutionaries alike. Both literature courses use the city as a living laboratory and immerse students in cross-cultural academic adventures. Students will participate in co-curricular activities that connect to this historic city, including the Paris Noir tour, a visit to James Baldwin's house, the Sorbonne, hip hop class at La Place, the Little Africa Tour, and tours of comic book and graphic novel shops.

HOUSING

The St. John's Paris location is in the heart of the city in the popular St. Germain district, in walking distance to some of the cities most famous attractions. Situated across the street from the Vaneau metro stop and the famous Le Bon Marché department store, the St. John's Paris location has all of the amenities you're used to at home. Students live in double rooms

MEALS

Students receive breakfast and dinner in the St. John's Paris dining hall from Monday through Thursday.

ACADEMIC SERVICE-LEARNING

Providing a helping hand to those in need is inspiring and humbling work. Through our academic service-learning offerings, you serve at schools, soup kitchens, and other locations throughout Paris. You not only gain unique insight into areas of Paris that are rarely spotlighted, but you also fulfill course-based experiential education requirements.

EXCURSIONS

Weekly excursions within Paris include a walking tour of Le Marais and trips to local museums, the Père Lachaise Cemetery and the palace of Versailles. Additional excursions include an overnight trip to Alsace-Lorraine or Brittany (depending on the academic year) as well as a four-day trip to the southern French region of Provence. All courses are designed to connect students through experiential visits to local sites and monuments.


