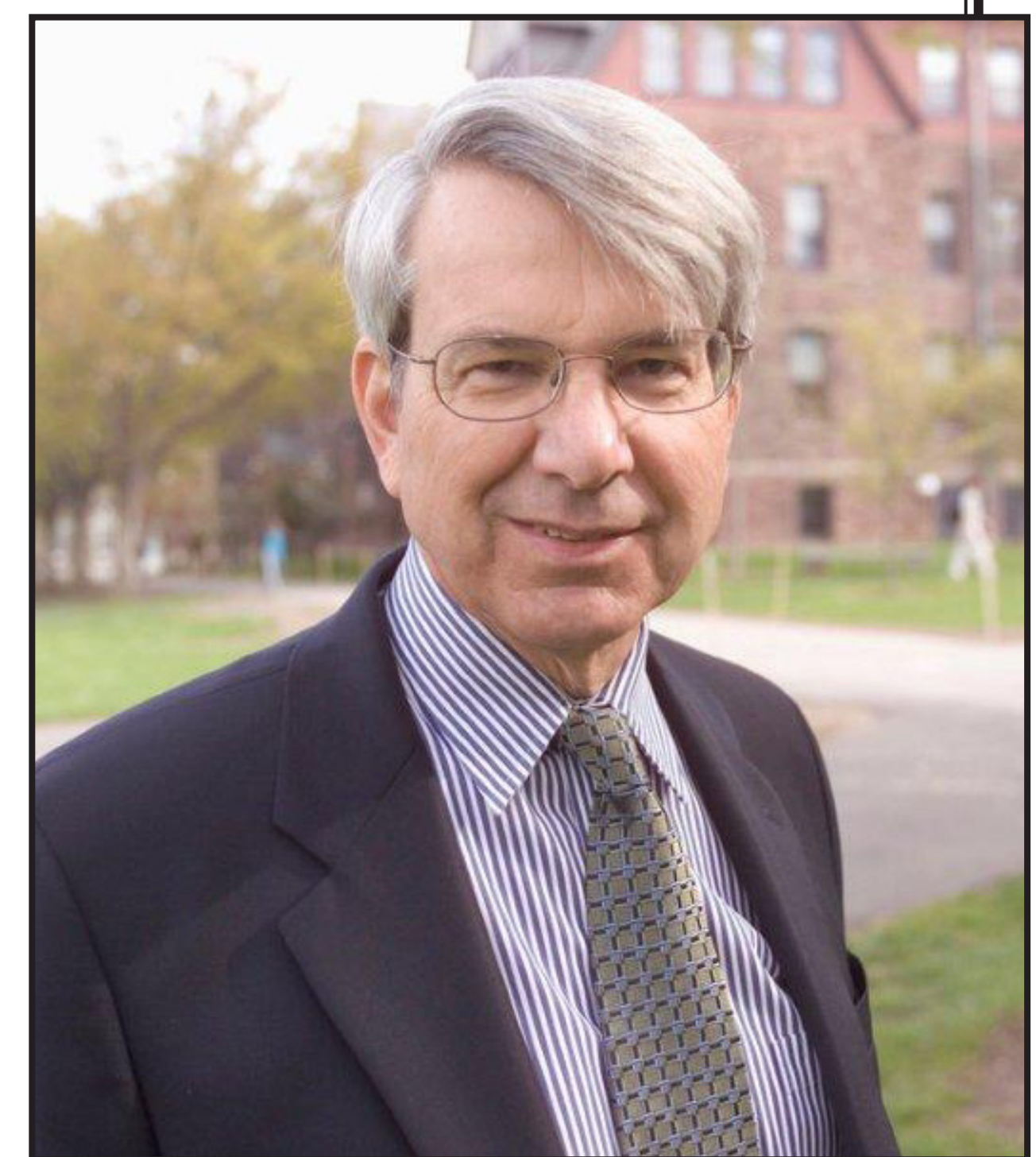

JONATHAN CULLER, 1916 PROFESSOR OF ENGLISH, CORNELL
“THEORY OF THE LYRIC”

JONATHAN CULLER RECEIVED HIS DOCTORATE IN MODERN LANGUAGES FROM OXFORD. HE TAUGHT AT CAMBRIDGE, OXFORD AND YALE BEFORE ARRIVING AT CORNELL, WHERE HE IS THE 1916 PROFESSOR OF ENGLISH AND COMPARATIVE LITERATURE. A FORMER PRESIDENT OF BOTH THE AMERICAN COMPARATIVE LITERATURE ASSOCIATION AND THE SEMIOTIC SOCIETY OF AMERICA, PROFESSOR CULLER IS THE AUTHOR OF MANY BOOKS ON FRENCH LITERATURE AND ON LITERARY THEORY, INCLUDING *FLAUBERT: THE USES OF UNCERTAINTY*, *THE PURSUIT OF SIGNS*, *ON DECONSTRUCTION*, AND THE HIGHLY INFLUENTIAL *STRUCTURAL POETICS*, WHICH WON THE JAMES RUSSELL LOWELL PRIZE. HIS NUMEROUS AWARDS AND ACHIEVEMENTS INCLUDE A RHODES SCHOLARSHIP, NEH AND GUGGENHEIM FELLOWSHIPS, AS WELL AS FELLOWSHIPS AT THE AMERICAN PHILOSOPHICAL SOCIETY AND AMERICAN ACADEMY OF ARTS AND SCIENCES.
